Kia ora from the Board of Trustees,

It has been a very unusual year for the Board of Trustees (BOT), as it has for all of us. We've managed to move our meetings to Zoom when necessary, which has meant we've been able to carry on with Board business reasonably easily. I'd like to thank the Board for their continued commitment, vision and compassion for our school and community during this year.

The BOT property team has continued to meet online and in person (depending on lock-down level) all year with the ministry and architects for our major 18 classroom building project. The architects are currently in the details design phase and will be submitting to council for consent once this stage is complete. There have been some challenges to overcome this year with the project and this has meant the timeline has moved slightly, but we remain committed to the project and will keep you informed as and when we gain consent and have a clearer indication for the project start date.

Due to the water restrictions sadly our fields have deteriorated with large cracks and holes occurring in the surface. We are of course very concerned about safety and disappointed to have to restrict the use of
