### Classes for 2023

Teachers are busy completing assessments on children and looking at combinations of children as we start to work on the organisation of classes for 2023. I am sure you will appreciate that with over 580 children to place in classes, this is a huge and complex task.

When placing children in classrooms, we consider a range of factors such as academic strengths and needs, social groups, a balance of boys and girls, and individual teacher strengths and passions. We do not stream classes. We use a computer programme called PLUTO that we have used for a number of years, and it has been helpful for us in this process.

We will be able to move some classes to the new classrooms at some stage in 2023, so this is an added consideration for us, in terms of where year levels will be placed, and which teachers will be in specific classes.


Please do not make specific teacher or class placement requests for your child. A lot can change between now and the start of 2023 and we have not confirmed year levels or teachers for 2023.

You will be informed of your child's 2023 class and teacher in the first week of December. Children will have an opportunity to meet with their new teacher and classmates before the end of this year.




# **New Classroom Block Update**

### **EOTC/Term 4 Events**

The end of Term 4 is always a busy, but special time as we end the year with some incredibly significant events. The first of these is our final House Assembly on **Monday 12**<sup>th</sup> of **December at 2:00pm**. This is where our 2022 House Leaders share some of their highlights from their experience as a House Leader. It is also when we announce our 2023 House Leaders. If your child is going to be a House Leader in 2023 you will be notified prior to the assembly as we hope you can make time to come and see them presented with their House Leader badge.

On **Wednesday 14th December** we have our Awards Assemblies. This is a very special time for our year 6s and a lovely way for them to remember their last day at Oteha Valley School.


